How the design of our classrooms supports children

When designing and planning our classrooms, we have considered what will help children to focus, feel safe and learn. You will notice that our school walls are painted white. This is chosen to help provide a calming and clear space. Our display boards are backed with natural colours and aim to be uncluttered. This aids children who have difficulties with focus and concentration by providing less distraction. Research shows that children with Autistic traits who can find bright colours overwhelming.



Each class in the school has a visual timetable. Research has also shown how much benefit these bring to children with a range of special educational needs. These timetables show all children what is coming next in the day. They can help by providing structure and routine, encourage independence, prevent frustration, confusion and anxiety and build confidence.



Summer Coffee Morning

The Lumi Nova team are hosting a coffee morning on Wednesday 12th June at 8:45am to introduce the Lumi Nova app and how it can potentially support your child. Lumi Nova is an intergalactic adventure game to support children to fight fears and manage worries. Whilst exploring planets your child breaks their fears and worries down into manageable steps, learning life-long skills and building resilience. It has been developed by BFB Labs with NHS clinicians and academics at the University of Reading.

Lumi Nova is ideal for children who may:

lack confidence to try new things seem unable to face simple everyday challenges find it hard to concentrate

have problems with sleeping or eating

have angry outbursts

have negative thoughts about what's going to happen

be avoiding everyday activities, eg. going to school, seeing friends

become irritable, tearful or clingy

Zone of proximal development (Learner can do with guidance)

Learner can do unaided

Vygotsky (1896 -1934) describes the area between a child's level of independent performance and what they can only do with support is the 'Zone of Proximal Development' (ZPD)

We should always aim to work within a child's ZPD as in the diagram

If you work within the area that the learner cannot do, the child will become frustrated, confused and disaffected with learning. Behaviour issues may become an issue.
