House Art Competition Reminder

We are happy to inform you that we are launching our Whole School House Art competition for 2024. This will be open to all children from Reception to Year 6. Each Year group will be given a theme (detailed below) to base their artwork around. Your child is free to choose any media they would like, however, we ask that all artwork is completed on the paper provided (with the exception of Year 2, Year 5 and Year 6). We ask that once your child has completed their creation, it is returned to their class teacher. Please ensure that your child's entry is clearly labelled with their **name**, **class** and **house** on the back of their artwork. **The deadline for all submissions is Monday 10**th **June**.

Reception: The Wonderful World of Colour!

This might include creating a vibrant piece of artwork by colour mixing using paint, pastels, colouring pencils or even layering different coloured tissue papers. This could be abstract, observational or from your imagination.

Year 1: Patterns, Patterns Everywhere!

This might include collaging, painting, printing or even creating a detailed observational drawing of the wonderful patterns inspired by our environment e.g. a fir cone, a shell, road markings, flowers, plants or leaves.

Year 2: iPad a Dream...

This might include using an iPad to create a digital piece of artwork based on a dream that you have had or something dreamlike. If an iPad is not available, you could take a photo of your artwork and digitally enhance it e.g. alter colours, add filters or extra details.

Year 3: This is Me!

This might be in the form of a self-portrait from observation or a piece of abstract artwork that expresses your thoughts, feelings, identity, ambitions or dreams.

Year 4: Time to Zoom!

Looking through a view finder* you could create a close up observational drawing of something interesting. This could include a cross- section of a natural object, a man-made material, or you may choose to look at something from an unusual angle e.g. a fir cone, a shell, flowers, inside of a fruit, cogs, mechanisms or unique architecture.

*Take a small piece of black card and cut a small square or rectangle in the middle. Use this to look through and capture part of an object that you find interesting.

Year 5: My Life Through a Lens

Using a camera or any digital device, can you capture an image that depicts your life or an interesting aspect of it? You might want to think about the angle and composition of your photograph. Your picture could be in colour, black and white or be altered using any digital effects. Once completed, print your photograph in A4 and bring to school in an envelope or plastic wallet to protect your image.

Year 6: Reuse, Recycle, Re-wear!

Create an item to wear e.g. a bag, a hat, a broach, an item of clothing, necklace, etc. using any materials of your choice. You could use materials such as old fabrics, fabric dye, plastic bags, string, threads, wire, paper, and packaging. You could embellish with bottle lids, beads, stitching, patterns from packaging and anything else you find lying around!

School Library Update


Over recent months, we have been reviewing the books that are available for children to read and borrow in our school library. We have updated some of the literature and children are now able to visit the library at lunchtime again.
